

How to make your own Windowful display....

Step One

Gather your supplies:

- Black card/paper
- Coloured tissue/crepe paper
- Ruler
- Scissors/craft knife
- Tape
- Glue
- Blu-tac

Step Two

Choose and measure your window:

- Decide which windows can easily be seen from outside.
- Choose a window that can be easily reached.
- Measure your window make sure you check twice to be as accurate as possible!



Step Three

Plan your design:

- Sketch out a simple plan of your design, to get an idea of how the final design will look.
- Simple is better! Don't overcomplicate your design as it will be difficult to cut out intricate parts or to see finer details from a distance.
- If you do have fiddly parts to cut out, using a craft knife and a cutting board to do this is helpful.
- If needed, remember to get an adult to help you or do the cutting parts for you.
- When you've decided your design, size your black card to the window. You might have to stick pieces of card together.





Step Four


Cutting and sticking:

- Cut out the parts of your design that you want the light to come through.
- Once you've cut out your design, turn your display over and begin gluing tissue paper to cover the cut-out parts.
- You can layer the tissue paper to achieve different opacity levels and blended colours.
- When you're happy with your design, attach it to your window using blu-tac or tape.









Step Five

Illuminate your design on Friday 28 February & Saturday 1 March between 6pm - 9pm.

- Make sure your window has a good light source behind it to illuminate your beautiful design!
- Move a lamp closer to the window if needed
